Students with a physical or mental impairment will be auditioned under exactly the same criteria as able-bodied students. Disability and Age are disregarded providing they can successfully complete a physically demanding and specialised dance training course for the duration of the three years, followed by reasonable expectations of a professional performance career in dance. In cases where it is not thought to be possible or that the course will not be of benefit to the individual, the School will seek to guide the applicant towards an appropriate alternative.
